

A unique and innovative program that highlights artistic talent and beautifies our surroundings, the Jackson Riverwalk Sculpture Project is a temporary installation of public artwork in downtown Jackson. The program is a collaboration between the Arts and Culture Alliance of Jackson County (ACAJC), Consumers Energy, the City of Jackson, and the Ella Sharp Museum.

The sculptures, on loan from the artists for a two-year period (2003-2005), are located near the Grand River and on the plaza of Consumers Energy's headquarters.
